Rural Inclusion is a UK-registered non-profit organisation driving economic development in rural communities in developing countries, through a global network of ambassadors and local strategic partners.

The Rural Inclusion vision is for individuals in rural communities across developing countries to have the tools and knowledge to create sustainable economic growth, increase resilience against climate shocks, and maintain healthy lives.

Our first innovation is the Ostrii platform, an offline mobile app available on Android and iOS for local organisations to use in delivering education programmes to rural communities. The initial focus of education on Ostrii is financial literacy, with content created in the form of animated videos in local languages.

Inclusion Ambassador Network

Through the learnings in Rural Inclusion's initial research in Uganda, it was clear that innovation was needed in training programmes in rural communities, and that this was not a challenge limited to Uganda. As a small organisation with a global vision to deliver real impact, there was a need to build a community of like-minded individuals.

After sharing field work in Uganda, our first Inclusion Ambassadors joined the team. In March 2022, the Inclusion Ambassador network was formalised into country teams, with the initial teams being Uganda, Malawi, Kenya, Tanzania, Rwanda and Zambia.

The Inclusion Ambassador network is a programme for experts in the fields of finance, agriculture and international development, to connect, learn, and implement economic development projects in their country.

The Inclusion Ambassadors are an exclusive group of individuals who have been specifically selected due to their expertise, knowledge and passion for driving rural development.

An Inclusion Ambassador is a local champion of change, ready to drive projects focusing on economic development, share experiences with peers, and collaborate with ambassadors across the world to drive the vision of Rural Inclusion.

The Inclusion Ambassador network is at the core of Rural Inclusion's operations, and the organisation is committed to building a team to provide the tools and support needed for ambassadors to deliver local change.

Rural Inclusion currently has 35 Inclusion Ambassadors across eight countries (Uganda, Kenya, Tanzania, Zambia, Rwanda, Malawi, El Salvador & Peru), with experts who work for Central Banks, Governments, United Nations Agencies, World Bank, International NGOs, Banks, Insurers, Technology organisations.

Through the current Inclusion Ambassador programme in Sub-Saharan Africa, ambassadors are provided with networking opportunities through task forces and working groups, along with the opportunity to implement their own economic development projects. Other benefits include:



Inclusion Ambassador Masterclasses

Masterclasses will be regularly offered to Inclusion Ambassadors on topics that are voted for by the community.



Attend conferences and local events

Inclusion Ambassadors have the opportunity to represent Rural Inclusion in industry conferences and local events.



Feature in project documentaries and reports

If the opportunity arises, Inclusion Ambassadors will be invited to feature in project documentaries and learning reports in local projects.



Field Visits

Inclusion Ambassadors will have the opportunity to travel to the field to engage with rural groups, and participate in projects.



Participate on webinars and Twitter spaces

Rural Inclusion will organise regular webinars and Twitter spaces on specific topics, with ambassadors having the opportunity to join panels.



Attend group language classes

For ambassadors that wish to learn a new language for professional development, Rural Inclusion can facilitate group teaching.



Access learning resources

Where possible, Rural Inclusion will offer further learning opportunities to Inclusion Ambassadors through partner organisations, such as industry associations and academia



Ambassador certificates

Certificates will be introduced into the ambassador programme, for those completing a task force, implementing a project, and completing a year of service.
